• Update on EISTC Bill--You can still help!

Dear Parents:

Last week, you received a notice about House Bill 521because we have students at PC who receive a scholarship through the Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credits program. This program has helped thousands of students receive the education that best meets their needs.

The bill is still active and it is vital that we still actively pursue reaching out to our delegates to have our voices heard.

If you already sent in your opposition message to your delegate--THANK YOU! And thanks to the many parents who emailed saying they sent theirs in! If you haven't had the chance to do so, the directions are below. Your help is critically needed to save it!

If we do not stop this bill, our school will lose resources that support scholarships. Your children may or may not be part of this program, but either way, all our impacted by the loss of these funds. You can help drive home the importance of this funding to keep our student population strong. With strong enrollment numbers, we are able to provide an engaging curriculum, employ highly qualified teachers and maintain state-of-the-art programs and facilities. Without this vital funding, our budget will be significantly impacted--by hundreds of thousands of dollars.

I am a resident in your district and on behalf of the students of Peninsula Catholic High School, I urge you to **oppose HB 521**. This bill would eliminate the Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credits (EISTC) program. Over 40% of our students receive an EISTC scholarship and it has changed their lives to be able to attend our school. Without the EISTC scholarships, these families, who contribute to society and work several jobs to provide for their families, would not be able to afford non-public funded, tuition-based education programs like Peninsula Catholic High School. We have been open since 1903, serving local and military families for over 115 years. We recently received the Purple Star Award for our outreach to military families.

This scholarship program is vital to our families and many others. For the sake of the students we serve and for their future, please do not take this opportunity away from them. We ask that you do everything in your power to preserve this program for these students who love attending Peninsula Catholic, and for the many other children who rely on this program in our community and all across Virginia. Therefore, this is a request that you **oppose HB 521**.
