- Drop Off and Pick Up Days for School Items. Mrs. Padilla will be sending all families a sign up to select a date (beginning June 9) to both drop off and pick up items. This includes but will not be limited to--dropping off used books for the book sale, gently used uniforms, calculators, chromebooks, chargers and earbuds, library books,art supplies, loaner textbooks, etc. it also includes picking up your student's yearbook (YAY!), art portfolios, unclaimed awards, and other items. Please do not drop off or ask to pick up any of the items mentioned above until your designated sign up time in order to follow CDC guidelines and keep our staff and families safe.
- Sign Up for SAT English Prep Class, June 8-12. Mr. Penrod will be offering an SAT Prep Class the week of June 8 from 9:00 AM-12:00 PM; Cost is \$260 per person; class size is limited to the first 9 people who sign up using this form. Social distancing guidelines will be followed and all participants must wear a facemask. You may pay for the course the first day of class. At least 5 students must sign up by Friday, June 5 or the class will be cancelled.
- New Service Requirements for Summer 2020. Service is the fulfillment of our baptismal promises and our patriotic duty. We are called to be a compassionate and just people in imitation of Jesus. All students in grades 9 -12 are required to complete a minimum of 20 hours of service each year to be eligible to graduate (with 5 of those hours being completed in their theology classes). This project will still be required, culminating in a project due Tuesday, September 8, 2020 for students in grades 9-12. Due to this period of social distancing, immuno-compromised students, and the preference for students to stay at home during this time, we have created some alternative approved service projects that students in all grade levels can complete with little to no contact with others, while still fulfilling their call to serve. - After finalizing classes (submitted projects, finished the last tests, etc), seniors should use the Google Takeout service to take all their @peninsulacatholic.org data with you. The instructions to do this are on the PC website (students tab).
- Once all seniors are finished with all classes, Mrs. Weser will begin the process of deprovisioning your chromebook releasing PCHS's settings and wiping it clean. Please secure any files that you may have stored on your chromebook as the internal memory of the device will be wiped in the process.
