#### **News and Announcements**

- Parent Alert Test on Wednesday, September 9th at 10:00 AM. Peninsula Catholic High School uses Parent Alert that enables school personnel to notify all households and parents by phone within minutes of an emergency or unplanned event that causes early dismissal, school cancellation or late start. (We will continue to report school closings due to weather on the local TV stations and on www.peninsulacatholic.org.) The service will also be used to communicate general announcements or reminders. When appropriate, some messages might be relayed via Email or text.
  We will test this system by email, text messaging, and phone. Please review the letter sent home in August for more details.
  Should you not receive the three different messages, please check your settings in FACTS Parent Portal on the PCHS website. If you need help clarifying the issue, please contact Mrs. Padilla.
- First Tag Day of the Year--For a VERY good cause! In a change from previous years, tag day money will be collected in Homeroom. Students are asked to bring exactly one dollar as teachers will not be able to make change for bills over \$1. It was originally scheduled for this week, but for planning purposes and to hold off until after Add/Drop and the switch from Virtual to On-Campus (and vice-versa) is concluded, it has been rescheduled for Wednesday, September 16th. - Parent and Student Responsibilities for Student Absences (on-campus and virtual)

**On-Campus Learners:** A student who is usually on-campus but is absent may attend virtually; however, parents must still notify the main office of the absence (either email to Mrs. Warren OR sending in a note with your student the next day). If no note is presented, the absence will be considered unexcused and the student will receive a zero for the day.

## **Virtual Learners**

The zero policy (see above) is also true for virtual learners who do not attend class. Parents of virtual learners are also asked to email Mrs. Warren in the Main Office the day of the absence **but must also email the teachers**. (This is required since students will not be able to present an admittance slip to teachers. Unless notified otherwise by the principal, teachers will note the absence as excused.)
