Morning Procedure Reminders - Sophomore Parents are reminded that after dropping off your student in the morning at their entrance, you must turn right, merge into the traffic entering from Harpersville, and wind through the main parking lot. Trying to go straight and take a direct left to go to the light is unsafe for you and drivers coming into the school. Please do not take shortcuts for the safety of all.

During morning drop-offs parents are required to wait until their student has been temperature checked before departing. If your student is not in the building by 7:45 am they are considered late and parents must wait a few minutes until their student is temperature checked before departing.
