Reminder Portraits will be held tomorrow, October 6, 2020.

Students in grades 8-11 may wear the following:

- **--Gentlemen:** Dress slacks, dress shoes or Sperry-type topsiders, dress socks, belt, collared dress shirt--no polos; ties are optional. You may wear a sweater if you wish. All young men should be clean-shaven.
- **--Ladies:** Dress slacks or skirt and modest blouse or dress (skirt and dress should be no shorter than the top of the knee), dress shoes. Moderate and appropriate jewelry and makeup.

Students who do not wish to dress up in the manner just outlined are required to be in forum dress instead.

Seniors should wear their regular M-F uniform and will have their Student ID pictures taken if they did not get a senior portrait taken this summer. (Seniors will have a makeup day for formal Senior Portraits on November 17.)

Read all the way through to find out the GIFT Mrs. Franklin gave the whole school in honor of PC's 117th Birthday!

Today is Peninsula Catholic's 117th Birthday! PC was originally established in 1903 as St. Vincent de Paul School for Girls by the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth. Catholic philanthropists Thomas Fortune Ryan and his wife, Ida Mary Barry Ryan, donated a brick school and convent as the first home of St. Vincent de Paul School. The school became co-educational in 1929. In 1966 the school's name was changed to Peninsula Catholic High School to emphasize its role as an institute of learning for the entire region.

PC was relocated to where it sits today on Harpersville Road in 1995.

We went from a drafty four-room brick building to the modern facility where, today, our students learn, play, and pray.

The true reason that PC has thrived as long as it has is because of the amazing educators and students who have graced the halls both back in the days that we were St Vincent's and today as Peninsula Catholic. But, this year has been particularly challenging with COVID impacting our lives in so many ways. As we prepared to teach students both in person and virtually, we had to figure out how best to do that and keep them as safe as possible. While that was going on, teachers were determined, committed and steadfast in their desire to return to school and to give you the best learning experience possible. And the students wanted to come back. And in their desire to return, they have donned your masks and sat 6 feet away from others, adhering to the staggered schedule and lunch break guidelines. As a community, we have not only accepted the challenges this year brought, but we have been determined to not allow those challenges to keep us from our school and from each other. The students, their teachers, and the staff have worked hard and done everything that has been asked of them--and it has been both exhausting and stressful at times.

So today we celebrate our heritage and the history we are making **even today** because of our stalwart commitment to PCHS in the midst of a pandemic.

As you know, on a birthday it is customary to give a gift and since all of us make up Peninsula Catholic, this gift is for everyone--students, staff, and faculty. As Mrs. Franklin thought about what gift to give, she couldn't think of one thing everyone might like--all 300 of us--no matter our age, gender, style, or tastes. Then it hit her...the perfect gift.

And So, Ladies and Gentlemen, as Principal of Peninsula Catholic High School, Mrs. Franklin formally announced that this Friday, October 9, 2020 be declared an official school holiday. There will be no school for students, staff or Faculty and because students also have Monday off, the students will have a four day weekend!
